## ANNUAL MEETING

The vote taken in connection with the last bulletin was unanimous in the opinion that the annual meeting of the Association should be held in Columbus, Ohio, at the same time as the Institute for Education by Radio at Ohio State University. The date for this Institute has recently been changed to meet with the convenience of many who objected to the original date. It will be held from June 8 to 11. This seems to make it advisable to change the time of the Association meeting to the same week. At a meeting in St. Louis on February 24, attended by eight members, the preference was for the later date, which has further been substantiated in correspondence.

The date of the annual meeting has hence been changed to June 8, 9 and 10, and the place Columbus, Ohio. Every station should plan immediately to send a representative. A return post card is enclosed with this bulletin, and its return will facilitate planning the program for the meeting. Last year's record of twenty-four stations represented should be brought.

## OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY INSTITUTE FOR EDUCATION BY RADIO
