It was probably written in the 1170s simultaneously with *Lancelot, the Knight of the Cart*, and includes several references to the action in that poem. In the poem, Yvain seeks to avenge his cousin Calogrenant who had been defeated by an otherworldly knight beside a magical storm-making fountain in the forest of Broceliande.
